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Aims of the Session:

To work together with parents and carers to support and encourage children to learn the skills to keep themselves safer

Objectives of the session:

- ❖ To consider the importance of teaching children the skills to keep safer and reflect on key facts and figures
- ❖ To recognise how teaching children to keep safer links to the themes and commitments of the EYFS and the NSPCC guidance
- ❖ To understand key themes when teaching children to keep safer whilst considering recent changes to legislation regarding sex offenders and the use of correct terminology
- ❖ To develop an awareness of the risks and dangers that may be in the local community-online and in their own homes
- ❖ To reflect on our own practice and how we can implement effective safety messages in our settings following our duty of care in relation to safeguarding and whistle-blowing
- To consider key messages we can plan and use to teach children to keep themselves safer which includes
 - stranger danger
 - confidence & resilience
 - being lost
 - bodily awareness
 - secrets and surprises
- ❖ To develop a range of practical strategies and activities we can use in our settings to teach children safety awareness and empower children to stay safer
