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Aims of the session:

Objectives of the Session:

- To reflect upon strategies we may use to manage behaviours to promote safer working practices to reduce poor practice and complaints
- Review the settings behaviour policy and procedure, fairness and consistency
- Reflect upon the EYFS standards required to fulfil and maintain effective quality provision and understand our 'duty of care' as providers
- To consider how we work together in partnerships top promote fairness and consistence
- Defining the challenges we may face and understanding why consider the emotional wellbeing of children and young people
- Reflect and review theories and the impact of early care, neglect and how lifestyles impact upon behaviours
- Review external and personal factors and how they impact upon carers support
- Reflect and understand 'ABC' of managing behaviour
- To consider verbal intervention to support and manage behaviour safely and appropriately
- To maintain effective record keeping and observations to safeguard child and team
- Discuss aspects that cause and effect behaviour including communication barriers
- Share effective strategies we may use and consider boundaries and opportunity to compare and evaluate-time –out and thinking time
- Promote working together fairness and consistency to understand the behaviour intervention support teams and identify and reflect appropriate rewards and sanctions throughout
